Let X represent loss and suppose  $x_1, x_2, \ldots, x_n$  is a random sample on X. Suppose that the probability density function of X is given by

$$f(x) = \exp(a - x)$$

where x > a > 0. Show that

$$ES_p(X) = a - \frac{1}{p} \{ p \log(1-p) - p - \log(1-p) \}$$

and determine its maximum likelihood estimator. Please give full details.
