- By using less time in the lecture on doing examples (We probably used 3 or 4 lectures for examples on the ETT), the lecture could do more content. The lecture could either focus more on the theoretical background and proof all the theorems used, or focus on real world applications and explain the idea of using Extreme Value theory in more detail. The lecturer gave a huge list of articles and excerpts, that are really hard to understand without help, maybe some of those could be used in the lecture for example. The amount of emails sent by the lecturer was too big and sometimes unnecessary, since all the podcasts are posted on his website anyways and everybody knows how to get them. The lecture could be faster, the content is relatively easy to understand. The Exams on the other hand seem to be very tight on time.
- Clear separation of study materials for 3rd, 4th and 6th year students on the course website would have saved time going through material. Also, I am a student from your last years Statistical Methods class, have to mention that the material and manner in which it was taught felt very similar to that module.
